MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF SPARTANBURG, SOUTH CAROLINA July 21, 2015

PRESENT: Thomas Lounds, Jr., Molly Talbot-Metz, Brenda Thomas, Mac Hogan and Kittie Tullis

ABSENT: None

VACANCIES: Two (2) Commissioners

The meeting was held at the Executive Board Room of the Spartanburg Housing Authority, Spartanburg, SC 29306.

Chairman Lounds called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. He then announced that public notice of this meeting was posted at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the commencement of the meeting as required by the South Carolina Freedom of Information Act.

MOMENT OF SILENCE

ROLL CALL: Brenda Thomas, Mac Hogan, Molly Talbot-Metz, Kittie Collins-Tullis and Thomas Lounds, Jr.

<u>APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA:</u> A motion to approve the amended agenda that includes Action Item Resolution 2015-19 Directors and Officers Liability Policy and removal of the Special Presentation was made by Vice-Chair Talbot-Metz, seconded by Commissioner Thomas, and unanimously carried.

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES: A motion to approve the minutes of the June 15, 2015 Regular Board meeting was made by Commissioner Hogan, seconded by Vice-Chair Talbot-Metz and unanimously carried.

A motion to approve the minutes of the July 8, 2015 Special Board meeting was made by Commissioner Thomas, seconded by Commissioner Hogan, and unanimously carried.

<u>COMMISSION COMMENTS AND SPECIAL PRESENTATION:</u> Chairman Lounds commended the staff on the new format of the agenda. It is much easier for the Commissioners to understand and to see the work the staff does. He also commended Ms. Bates, our Executive Director, for leading the efforts on this revision.

Ms. Bates stated there was to be a special presentation for former Chairwoman Suzy Cole on this agenda. Chairwoman Cole is on vacation and would not be attending. This item was removed from the agenda.

<u>PUBLIC COMMENTS ON AGENDA ACTION ACTIONS:</u> Sheron Whiteside, Secretary of Frank Gooch Resident Council, stated the Council's concerns that the Resident Councils will no

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longer be picked up for the Board meetings. Many don't have transportation and there is no bus service after hours. They feel this is unfair to them and they would like us to reconsider this decision. The SHA Resident Councils are doing their job in our neighborhoods and they feel they should be allowed to attend our monthly meetings and be allowed transportation.

Chairman Lounds stated that we will take their concern into consideration.

ACTION ITEMS AND RESOLUTIONS:

1. Resolution 2015-16: Third Quarter FY 2015 Bad Debt Write-Offs

a. Bad debt write-offs for the third quarter of FY 2015 were presented in the amount of \$25,525.06, compared to the same period of FY 2014 write-offs of \$23,761.19. This is an increase of \$1,763.87 over the same third quarter in FY 2014.

A motion to approval Resolution 2015-16: Third Quarter FY 2015 Bad Debt Write-Offs was made by Vice-Chair Talbot-Metz, seconded by Commissioner Hogan, and unanimously carried.

2. Resolution 2015-17: Spartanburg Housing Authority (SHA) Procurement Policy

- a. We are bringing recommendations to the Board for revisions to our Procurement Policy.
 - i. One recommendation is that our current Procurement Policy has a small purchase threshold of \$100,000. This means that any item that exceeds this amount has to come to the Board for approval. We are recommending that the threshold be reduced to \$10,000. We believe that this would be more prudent to have more Board oversight.
 - ii. The second recommendation has to do with regulatory processes as far as HUD is concerned. There are two areas we want our Procurement Policy to be very clear that our policy does not cover; the Central Office Cost Center (COCC) and the Section 8 Program. By HUD regulations, neither one of these areas are regulatory and required to be governed by our current Procurement Policy. We are proposing to add Exhibit B to our Procurement Policy which states that the Section 8 Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Program and the Central Office Cost Center (COCC) not to be governed by our Procurement Policy. This also goes in hand with the lower dollar amount of \$10,000. While it is important that we do have oversight with these two areas, it simply does not require that oversight. This will help us to expedite matters in these two areas so we can move ahead more quickly.
 - 1. Ms. Bates stated that we will prepare internal procedures for these two departments. We will still come to the Board with any single purchases over \$10,000, and there is a signing threshold for various members of the departments so that even if it does get to the \$10,000, a couple of staff members will have signed off.

A motion to approval Resolution 2015-17: Spartanburg Housing Authority (SHA) Procurement Policy was made by Vice-Chair Talbot-Metz, seconded by Commissioner Thomas, and unanimously carried.

3. Resolution 2015-18: Emergency Information Technology (IT) Contract

a. We are asking the Board's approval on awarding an emergency Information Technology (IT) contract to a company to assist us in getting our IT infrastructure under control. We currently have a Systems Analyst who assists approximately 63 users in various locations. There is often a backlog that one person is just not able to manage. We also do not have inventory of our system; we don't know what we have. We have various pieces of equipment in various locations but we don't have an itemization of exactly what we have, as well as how old the equipment is. Additionally, we have not performed a backup. We are requesting permission to enter into a contract to approve for 90-days an IT contract award to IT Pros in an amount not to exceed \$28,000. We expect that during the 90-day period we will be able to gather information that will allow us to do either a full procurement for on-going IT services or have enough information to understand what kind of skills we need in an IT Manager.

A motion to approval Resolution 2015-18: Emergency Information Technology (IT) Contract was made by Commissioner Thomas, seconded by Commissioner Hogan, and unanimously carried.

4. Resolution 2015-19: Directors and Officers Liability Policy

- a. The Housing Authority provides Directors and Officers liability insurance that protects our Board of Commissioners and our Executive Director. The current policy we have expires on August 20, 2015 and the current insurer notified us that they no longer wish to provide us with this insurance coverage. We contacted a broker who helped us to shop for this insurance, so we have a new vendor who is willing to provide us with this insurance. The cost of the insurance for an annual period is \$14,750.0. With the previous provider, the cost of the insurance was \$11,650.00.
- b. Ms. Bates stated that our Procurement Manager worked with several companies to try to get us quotes, but we were not acceptable to other companies because we are considered a risk. This was the only company that we were able to have insurance with at this time. If we need to revisit to look for other companies later in the year, we will do that.

A motion to approval Resolution 2015-19: Directors and Officers Liability Policy was made by Vice-Chair Talbot-Metz, seconded by Commissioner Hogan, and unanimously carried.

INFORMATION REPORTS:

1. Face Forward (Ms. Bates):

- a. The Spartanburg Housing Authority in July of 2013 was awarded a grant in the amount of \$999,923.00 to administer a Face Forward Program. The grant was to be completed by September 30, 2015, with an additional year beyond that for monitoring. There initially had been some misunderstanding about eligibility. The grant was a diversion grant as part of a request from the Department of Labor and it turned out that South Carolina has a state law that has very specific parameters around the word "diversion." So the staff was not able to recruit many members. There should be 126 participants.
- b. In April of 2015, we had a visit from the Department of Labor and during that visit, the staff came to understand that there were other participants who could potentially be eligible and they would be youth between the ages of 17 and 24 who were engaged in some type of behavior that could lead them to criminal activity; something that they were doing or involved in. They weren't in trouble yet, but there was a likelihood they could become involved in those various types of behavior. This really opened up the pool of who could be served. The staff at that time went to aggressively try to get the grant the required amount of staff members, and we hired two case managers in April, 2015.
- c. At this time, we are trying to work with the Department of Labor to submit a modification to request additional time on the grant and to revise the budget as well as some of the objectives. They won't change the number of people we have to serve, but we have to change some of the things we said we would do. For example, the original grant stated that each participant would be in the grant for 40 months. We are looking to submit a modified narrative and a modified budget to the Department of Labor. They are willing to receive it and review it, and we are hoping they approve it so we can get the grant back on track.
 - i. Commissioner Lounds stated that this information is disappointing because we are in this position. It won't be an easy task to convince the Department of Labor that we can do it. He stated he is concerned that, as we were going forward, there weren't any alarm bells that went off that said we weren't meeting our goals and that we got to this point where we have very little time to complete the grant. This will be a great challenge. He appreciates the information finally getting to the Board and stated that if the Board can be of any assistance with the process, they are certainly willing to help because there is a great deal at stake.

MONTHLY REPORTS:

- 1. Executive Director (Ms. Bates):
 - a. Ms. Bates reported on a list of meetings, activities and accomplishments during her first thirty days. She completed a thirty minute one-on-one meeting with 53 staff members and still needs to meet with four staff members. This process was helpful for her as she learned a lot about Spartanburg, our employees and our agency. The engagement was very good. She has also had an opportunity to meet with members of the City, County, elected officials and other agencies. There has been recruitment activity to get a CFO on board.

- i. Vice-Chair Talbot-Metz asked for more information pertaining to the Oakview Mod-Rehab contract renewal. Ms. Bates stated there had been a delay in the approval of the contract because we were advised that the City had gone to court and had eminent domain awarded to them by the court for the property. HUD headquarters contacted us and they wanted the contract signed so she signed it. The City advised that they are expecting to go to court shortly to get possession of this contract as well, and we aren't really involved in the City's engagement with the property. She thought she needed to look into whether or not we should sign a contract where there was a court order for an eminent domain type order but HUD demanded that we sign it quickly.
- ii. Commissioner Hogan questioned as to whether we have had any luck with getting potential CFO candidates. Ms. Bates stated that we have not and that we have a Request for Quote (RFQ) out for temporary financial services. We had one vendor to respond that had issues with references. Vice-Chair Talbot-Metz questioned as to whether this was unique to this area and if it is common among Housing Authorities. Ms. Bates stated that it is not. Part of our problem is the publicity of events at the Housing Authority that perceives us and, as a candidate you look to see what it going on. It's challenging and we don't offer more pay than a Housing Authority who is moving along daily without these challenges.

2. Settlements and Claims/Legal (Ms. Bates):

a. Ms. Bates reported on the types of claims or legal actions that we are currently involved in and their status. We currently have five claims, which four involve current Public Housing residents. All of these claims are currently on-going.

3. Development (RAD) (Daryl Dalton):

- a. Daryl Dalton reported that the Housing Authority is working to develop eight senior units at Page Lake in partnership with Spartanburg County. We hired an Architectural and Engineering Firm, Cauthen & Associates, LLC, to develop the plans and specifications and to assist with this project. This project will be funded predominately with HOME Funds from the County, but the SHA will have a loan estimated to be between \$184,000 and \$250,000, which will be utilized for development and repaid from net operating income over the next 20 years. The current projected cost of the project is estimated at \$1,386,308.26. The county has proved \$475,616.81 in HOME Funds and plans to provide at least another \$563,602.41 in HOME Funds. Ms. Bates has been meeting with Spartanburg County and just this week, the County has made a commitment of an additional \$140,000 towards this project.
 - i. Chairman Lounds expressed concern of oversight and monitoring of the project. Daryl Dalton stated Cauthen & Associates, LLC will be overseeing and monitoring this project. Ms. Bates also stated that we have our Construction Facilities Coordinator, Tyrone Meadows, who will also be monitoring this project on the agency's behalf.

4. Capital Improvements (Daryl Dalton):

a. Daryl Dalton reported that we currently have eight open Capital Fund grants, three of which are Program grants and five are Replacement Housing Factor Funds. The Program grants fund capital improvements on our Public Housing units and Replacement Housing Factor Funds are used to construct new Public Housing units such as the units constructed on Brawley Street.

5. Housing Choice Voucher (Tiffany Askew):

a. Tiffany Askew reported that the Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Program lease-up rate is currently at 97%. Three vouchers were issued this month, eight vouchers expired and 52 families are currently searching for housing. The HUD requirement is that the PHA utilizes 98% of its vouchers or 98% of its allocated funding. We are currently at 101% of budget utilization or units leased.

6. Asset Management (Jill O'Connell):

- a. Jill O'Connell reported that Ms. Bates and Daryl Dalton went to HUD Columbia to address our vacancy issues. Since then, we have been diligently working on leasing up our vacant units by opening all our waiting lists and turning units with our contractors. The SHA staff has been very supportive in this effort. Tiffany Askew's staff has been assisting with applications. Jessica Holcomb has been helping with banners and posters and Valerie Forsberg's staff has been outreaching to community agencies, getting postcards out that we are accepting applications, and staging a model unit at Archibald with another unit planned at Tobias. Margaret Woodson has been working to procure services and supplies for unit turns. Jim Gardiner, our police liaison, has been completing many of the background checks on our applicants. We have sent out 730 post cards to wait list participants, including the Section 8 wait list. Jessica will also be doing outreach to all our area churches, supplying them with the post cards, and asking them to put out an announcement on this information. We also have information on our Face Book page and we have already had 10,000 hits on our website.
 - i. Vice-Chair Talbot-Metz questioned about Cedar Springs and the work being done there. Daryl Dalton stated that we don't have any ownership or management interest in this Tax-Credit property. They have 19 Public Housing units that we administer the subsidy. There is some Section 8 with voucher holders. Over the years, our relationship and communications with the entity there has changed from time to time but it has improved.

7. Community and Supportive Services (Valerie Forsberg):

a. Valerie introduced Lou Ann Parris, our Adult Education Instructor, to the Board. Lou Ann has also been working with our youth but is now working with adults. She has 20 adults and 30 children that she educated during the month of June. Our annual Fatherhood event had only children participating where they made picture frames, decorated gift bags and made cards for their father or other adult role model for Father's Day. The Summer Feed Hot Lunch Program fed 85 children daily between Camp Croft and Victoria Gardens. We have our Marche Gault Scholarship Program each year and this year we are anticipating awarding seven scholarships. Valerie read excerpts from one of the applicant's biography about how Ms. Gault (a former employee of the Housing Authority with Resident Services) was an integral part of her childhood. We have Homeownership classes coming in August. The Elderly/Disabled Program focused on health programs this month. The Connections Program Coordinator continues to work with 10 participants in employment training.

8. Human Resources (Brooke Coleman):

- a. Brooke Coleman reported we had two new hires, two temporary employees and 7.5 open positions during the month of June. We are currently recruiting for the CFO position, a Director of Housing Operations, a Property Manager Assistant, a Face Forward Coordinator, an Elderly Disabled Services Coordinator, a part-time YouthBuild Follow-Up Case Manager and two Maintenance Mechanics. Several employee relations issues are in the process of being addressed. Training methods are being researched in hopes to improve our climate and culture in areas of harassment, professional dress and appropriate behavior in the workplace. We have two potential retaliation claims. Billing for Aflac, Allstate, PEBA and Wage Works have not been reconciled. Therefore, some employees have been paying incorrect premium amounts. These bills will be reconciled monthly moving forward. Evaluation of job titles, duties and FLSA classifications is underway. We are working on instituting a Safety Committee. One person returned from a leave of absence and there was one workers' compensation incident this month.
- 9. Procurement (Margaret Woodson): No report; still in the development process
- 10. Finance (Joe Calicdan):
 - a. Please refer to written report for more detailed figures.

SHA STAFF COMMENTS:

- 1. Ms. Bates stated that our staff has really done a great job in helping her to acclimate and supporting things we have to get done. There is a lot of hard work to be done. We have had really good cooperation and investment from our staff and she really appreciates them and looks to do really great things with the staff.
- 2. Vice-Chair Talbot-Metz suggested that food be served at the beginning of the Board meeting since the new meeting format of the Board Meeting is taking longer than in the past.

Chairman Lounds called the meeting to order at 12:15 p.m. He then announced that public notice of this meeting was posted at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the commencement of the meeting as required by the South Carolina Freedom of Information Act.

MOMENT OF SILENCE

ROLL CALL: Brenda Thomas, Mac Hogan, Molly Talbot-Metz, Kittie Collins-Tullis and Thomas Lounds, Jr.

<u>APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA:</u> A motion to approve the amended agenda that includes a supporting document revision for Action Item #2: Unit Turns was made by Commissioner Hogan, seconded by Commissioner Thomas, and unanimously carried.

COMMISSION COMMENTS AND SPECIAL PRESENTATION: None

PUBLIC COMMENTS ON AGENDA ACTION ACTIONS: None

ACTION ITEMS AND RESOLUTIONS:

1. Resolution 2015-20: Foreclosed Homes

- a. Over a period of years, the Housing Authority has been involved in providing mortgages for some clients. A number of these loans have defaulted and have been foreclosed. We now have those homes for sale. We currently have contracts on two of these homes. We have negotiated the sale prices and we would like the Board's approval to sell these two homes. The proceeds from the sale of these homes will go to retire the debt from the loan that the Housing Authority borrowed from BB&T.
 - i. Commissioner Hogan questioned as to whether appraisals were done on these two homes. Daryl stated that these homes were appraised originally years ago at the time they were sold to those clients. For this purpose, we knew that a bank was only going to allow the client to purchase that home based upon an appraised value. We did not personally incur the price of

these appraisals. The bank's appraisal of these homes has been a part of the negotiation process. The 312 Wilmont Street home is under contract with Shayla Woodson for \$75,000 and the 155 West Freemont home is under contract with Kim McDaniel for \$68,000.

A motion to approve Resolution 2015-20: Foreclosed Homes was made by Commissioner Thomas, seconded by Commissioner Hogan, and unanimously carried.

2. Resolution 2015-21: Turned Units Change Order

- a. We are coming to the Board for approval of a change order to the purchase order issued to a contractor for unit turns so we can lease these units. We have discussions in recent months about our need to prepare units in order to lease them. This contractor is a contractor under the State contract which allows us to proceed. We are changing this purchase order that was issued a couple weeks ago prior to the change we made in our Procurement Policy. The revised list of units to be turned under this purchase order was provided to the Board and this contactor will be doing the work on these listed units. Some of the work has been done already because the purchase order was issued previously. This work will not exceed \$100,000 and we would like the Board's permission to change the purchase order that was issued.
- b. We would like to have some flexibility as this work proceeds if we need to pull an item out and put another one in. As an example, the contractor told us he would install a hot water heater for us for \$238 and we have approximately five units that only need a new hot water heater installed. We would like to have the ability that if we need to, that we could drop one of these units off the list enabling us to add five water heaters.
 - i. Chairman Lounds questioned as to the thing that is causing these changes is that HUD is giving us different direction and if this is correct. Daryl stated that when we first started, we put a number of our scattered sites homes in this work because it was our understanding that we had to get these homes ready to rent. Recently, we received direction from HUD that stated we should not be focusing on these scattered site homes now because we will have to get some additional approval from HUD before we can rent these homes. We had already started some of the work on these homes and we had to pay the contractor for the work done. The original list was all scattered site homes. Now we are only doing work on four or five of these homes and the rest on Public Housing units.
 - ii. Commissioner Hogan questioned as to whether we have used this contractor before. Daryl stated that he does not believe we have used them in the past. We have had a number of meetings with the contractor and are very comfortable with them performing this work.

A motion to approve Resolution 2015-21: Turned Units Change Order to Lesco Restorations, Inc. was made by Vice-Chair Talbot-Metz, seconded by Commissioner Hogan, and unanimously carried.

3. Resolution 2015-22: Accounting Services Change Order and Extension

- a. In 2013, the HUD Office of the Inspector General (OIG) was here and they gave us a list of hundreds of thousands of dollars that they presumed were expenses that weren't justified. Ms. Bates went through these expenses line by line and looked for ways to mitigate these expenses and one of the things we found had to do with the use of Casterline beyond the contract period and it was \$42,000. Had the staff come to the Board and requested an extension of the contract by this amount, it would have been approved and that would take away the Housing Authority's appearing that it used money in an unauthorized manner. We are asking the Board's permission for a retroactive resolution that approves the extension of this contract from November, 2011 to September, 2012, which is the period we received a finding for and that the total amount was just under \$42,000. It is our hope that we will be able to submit that as an answer to this \$41,466 to HUD and that they will accept that and not cause the Housing Authority to repay those funds. We received the services and this would be an administrative matter that would resolve this.
 - i. Commissioner Talbot-Metz questioned Ms. Bates that in her experience if this will be acceptable to HUD. Ms. Bates stated this is better than doing nothing and having to repay the \$42,000. All HUD can say is that it is unacceptable.
 - ii. Chairman Lounds questioned as to whether this was run by Rector, Lofton and Reeder PC for their advice on whether this would be a good move or not. Ms. Bates stated that she could, but it is actually HUD that has to approve this. It would be better to ask for forgiveness than their permission.

A motion to approve the retroactive Resolution 2015-22: Accounting Services Change Order and Extension with Casterline was made by Commissioner Hogan, seconded by Vice-Chair Talbot-Metz, and unanimously carried.

4. Resolution 2015-23: Financial Services Contract

- a. We are requesting Board approval for us to enter into a contract for Financial Services. The Housing Authority has advertised for an accounting firm to assist us with a number of matters in the Finance Department. We still do not have a CFO. What we are looking for is someone to come into the Housing Authority to help us with responses to the OIG findings. We also have year-end closing that is coming up at the end of September, 2015. We received only one response to our solicitation for IFH Solutions, an Atlanta-based firm. We would like permission to enter into a contract dollar amount not to exceed \$50,000. We will give them task orders instead of a blanket contract. These task orders would be given to them one at a time until that particular task order was completed.
 - i. Commissioner Hogan questioned as to why we only received one response to our advertisement. Ms. Bates stated that we had some inquiries and a lot of them felt like we were asking too much for the amount of money in

- the initial Request of Quote (RFQ) that we sent out which was not to exceed \$95,000. Several vendors responded that they felt it was too short of time and not enough money. We have to look for a way to corral this and still be able to hire a CFO. We have spent a lot of money on contractors and we are not in the position that we need to be in, so we are trying to bite it off in small bites but still need to meet the deadlines in getting the audit findings corrected.
- ii. Commissioner Hogan questioned as to what due diligence was done with IFH Solutions; are we familiar with them? Ms. Bates stated that she contacted Housing Authorities that had utilized their services and also contacted our accountant and he had some experience with them before. They either got very glowing reports or not so great reports. The not so great reports stated that they work at a very high level but not so much at the granular level. Some of the work we need is at the granular level is what got her into the discussion with them on the task order. There are willing to do this and that allows us to give them a project and if they do it well we can give them another one. If they don't, we haven't entered into a \$100,000 contract.

A motion to approve Resolution 2015-23: Financial Services Contract with IFH Solutions was made by Commissioner Tullis, seconded by Commissioner Thomas, and unanimously carried.

5. Resolution 2015-24: Insurance Services Contract

- a. The Housing Authority purchases the vast majority of its insurance services through the South Carolina Budget and Control Board. Office of Insurance Reserve Fund. This in essence is a self-insured reserve fund. The State program only allows organizations like the Housing Authority governing entities to participate. Their rates are very attractive and much less than we could get insurance anywhere else. We have used this insurance for many years. Insurance is purchased on an annual basis. We are at our time to renew this insurance as our policy will end on August 31, 2015. The State Insurance Reserve Fund is in the process right now of reviewing all our records to determine the actual price for next year. Last year, we paid 187,902.76. We have taken this amount and increased it by 10% \$18,790.28) to reach a total of \$206,693.04 for the next year's premium. We are requesting the Board's approval on an amount not to exceed \$206,693 as we believe that any increase will be far less than the 10% figured. The State Insurance Reserve Fund also has program where you can prepay legal expenses. Our policy includes a standard level of coverage in the amount of \$15,000. What we may do, for instance, is that if the premium comes in at the same price as last year, we can take all or some of the difference and prepay towards legal expenses so it will be there in the event that we need it in the future.
 - i. Chairman Lounds asked if this has been the history with us. Daryl stated that it is not. This would be our first time utilizing this program. Ms.

Bates stated that we are going to review our legal expense history over the past year to see if some of that can be recovered through that portion of the policy. Procurement's suggestion was that we increase that level from the standard \$15,000 to a higher level because we have had a large amount of contact with attorneys recently.

A motion to approve Resolution 2015-24: Insurance Services Contract was made by Commissioner Hogan, seconded by Commissioner Tullis, and unanimously carried.

6. <u>Resolution 2015-25: Purchase of Air Conditioning Units for Archibald Hi-Rise and Archibald Village</u>

- a. This item relates to us getting our units ready for lease at Archibald Hi-Rise and Archibald Village. We have a current need to purchase 39 air conditioners so that we can get these units ready to rent. This is a purchase through the State contract. In a conversation with Ms. Bates, she has suggested that although the Board may approve this, we may not purchase 39 units at a time. We may just purchase 10 at a time so we can get these units up and running. Then we will be ready for the next 10 units.
 - i. Commissioner Hogan asked if the price included the wiring and installation of these units. Daryl stated this is for the equipment only with the exception of the Freon. These are wall units that come already assembled; they are ready to just be placed in the current space in the wall and plugged in. Our maintenance staff has the ability to install these units properly. The cost associated with this action item is only for the cost of the unit.

A motion to approve Resolution 2015-25: Purchase of Air Conditioning Units for Archibald Hi-Rise and Archibald Village was made by Tullis, seconded by Vice-Chair Talbot-Metz, and unanimously carried.

7. Resolution 2015-26: Financial Services Contract: Interim CFO Services

- a. IFH is a smaller contract for task orders, but we still someone to provide the remaining services in case IFH falls out or is not able to do the task. We are going to try to re-advertise. We have made some adjustments to the Request for Quote (RFQ). Initially we required a CPA; we are removing this from the RFQ and stating that they have to have accounting experience. Now we are willing to accept proposals of smaller bites of the original RFQ, so this is an over-arching contract that will cover the items that don't get covered in the IFH contract, as well as assisting us in onboarding a CFO candidate. We are asking that the Board allow us to enter into contract for Interim CFO services for one or more vendors not to exceed \$120,000.
 - i. Commissioner Hogan questioned as to who we are advertising with. Ms. Bates stated we are using South Carolina Business Opportunities (SCEBO), the Herald Journal, and the Government Financial Officers

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- Association of South Carolina (GFOASC). We will probably put an ad in our trade publications with Nahro and Phada, depending on cost.
- ii. Commissioner Hogan asked if we have reached out to Ed Memmott, City Manager, as far as utilizing an employee from the City. Ms. Bates has met with Mr. Memmott on several occasions and also has a standing monthly meeting with him. The City is trying to assist us on some other matters, but in terms of having staff that they can lend us or enter into an agreement, they are not able to do this due to the capacity.
- iii. Commissioner Hogan questioned as to if we have reached out to any of the employment/placement agencies. Ms. Bates stated we have used Robert Half who requires a starting rate of \$120,000 plus 28% of the salary if someone is placed. Gans, Gans & Associates is willing to do recruitment for \$15,000 but it would take approximately four months to complete the process and we just do not have that much time. We have ads in the local papers, Indeed, CareerBuilder, and other websites. Ms. Bates sent out an e-mail to every Executive Director of North Carolina Housing Authorities asking if they would be interested in entering into an intergovernmental agreement with us for some of these services. There are two interviews with CFO candidates scheduled next week. We are budgeting an annual salary of \$90,000 for the CFO and our Senior Accountant, Joe Calicdan, and he is working on leaving room in the budget in the event we need to raise this salary. Ms. Bates will send the RFQ and the CFO job description to the Board for their review.

A motion to approve Resolution 2015-26: Financial Services Contract: Interim CFO Services was made by Vice-Chair Talbot-Metz, seconded by Commissioner Hogan, and unanimously carried.

SHA STAFF COMMENTS:

- 1. Ms. Bates thanked the Board for coming today. We may occasionally call special meetings like this in order to get future contracts recommended to the Board for approval.
- 2. We have a new Board member, Andrew Poliakoff, a Spartanburg Attorney, and he is currently on vacation. The other appointee, Matt Copeland had to rescind as there were conflicts pertaining to some of our rules. The Mayor is searching for another commissioner to fill our vacancy.
- 3. A presentation for Suzy Cole is being planned at our August Regular Board meeting.
- 4. Orientation for the new commissioner will be scheduled and the current Board members are encouraged to attend this orientation. This may be scheduled as a "Lunch and Learn" event.
- 5. There may be a training session in September on the Housing Authority's upcoming budget for the new fiscal year.
- 6. Valerie Forsberg invited the Board to attend our National Night Out events at several of our sites on Tuesday, August 4, 2015.

OVERVIEW:

This report provides an update of activities and accomplishments of the executive director during the second 30 days of employment. Activities during this reporting period included interviews of candidates for the CFO and Director of Housing Operations positions. Ongoing review of efforts to improve leasing and regulatory compliance in several areas was also a continuing project. There are weekly meetings with the Accounting Manager in preparation of the budget for the new fiscal year. Meetings occurred with the Palladian vendor regarding a need for reduction in services on an ongoing basis. An aggressive plan was launched to complete a modification of the Face Forward grant, which involved interaction and multiple meetings with the Youth Stop organization, and Piedmont Community Action Agency. The modification was submitted on July 31st. Thirty-minute meetings were conducted with remaining staff members. All staff has had an opportunity to meet with me. Other meetings included Gregory Pest Control, regarding the bed bug treatment protocol, the Urban League, Upstate WIB, and the Clerk of Court and I was a guest at the Spartanburg Rotary Club. I participated in monthly meetings with the Northside Advisory group as well as a meeting with the City Manager and former Mayor. The agency hosted a United Way Campaign.

There have been ongoing conversations with the HUD Field office, and participation in conference calls regarding the RAD projects. I have visited potential commercial sites for the relocation of the SHA Central Office Cost Center. On a weekly basis, I meet with staff directly responsible for various programs and services in the agency, including Procurement, Human Resources, Resident Services and Information Technology. Adjustments are continuing which will result in improved efficiency and regulatory compliance in these areas. The leasing

OVERVIEW:

This report provides an update of current and ongoing major programs and project activities and identifies top priorities. The highlights of this month's report are:

Project Development Activity:

Page Lake

An Invitation for Bids (IFB) was issued the week of July 19, 2015 with the plans & specifications prepared by the Architectural & Engineering Firm of Cauthen & Associates, LLC. A Pre-Bid Conference was held on August 11, 2015 and bids are due at 2:00 PM on September 3, 2015. We plan to request the Board of Commissioners to authorize the approval of a contractor at the regular Board of Commissioners meeting on September 15, 2015.

Since last month's report, the County has committed an additional \$140,000.00 to this project. Spartanburg County has already provided SHA with \$475,616.81 in HOME Funds and plans to provide at least another \$703,602.41 in HOME Funds, please note that this is a \$140,000.00 increase from last month's report. At this time SHA's loan is estimated to be somewhere between \$184,000 and \$207,116.04.

The project will be funded predominately with HOME Funds from Spartanburg County, but SHA will have a loan, which will be utilized for development and repaid from the net operating income over the next twenty years. While the exact amount of the project and the loan will not

be determined until, the bids are opened and the final price is negotiated, the current projected total cost of the project is estimated to be \$1,386,308.26.

In partnership with Spartanburg County, the Spartanburg Housing Authority continues to work on the development of eight senior units at Page Lake. The location of these units will be immediately adjacent to the Ridge at Southport on Grant Central Avenue. The Ridge is one of our Low Income Housing Tax Credit Properties.

Highland Crossing

Highland Crossing is the new 9% Low Income Housing Tax Credit and Rental Assistance Demonstration apartment complex that will be constructed on the site of the former Cammie Clagett Public Housing apartment complex. SHA's development partner for these 72 new units is Community Housing Partners (CHP). CHP is currently abating the asbestos from the 40 units that are on the site just across the street from Macedonia Church. As soon as the asbestos abatement is completed, the demolition will begin. As soon as the demolition is completed construction on the new units will be completed. It is anticipated that the construction of this units will take at least 12 months. Once these units are complete former Cammie Clagett residents will have the first right to occupy these units. These units will be tax credit units and CHP's management company will manage these units for at least the first 3 years. It is SHA's desire and plan to manage these units after the first three years.

SHA7

The SHA7 project is a Rental Assistance Demonstration Projected which will complete rehabilitation on 338 units in the following seven apartment complexes; JC Anderson, Tobias, Gooch, Watson, Barksdale, Leland and Spruce. Our final financing application has been submitted to HUD for approval. We are anticipating approval in August. This project also includes Bonds and 4% Tax Credits. Our Bond Closing Timeline projects closing on the Bonds on November 9.

Our development partner for this project is Hunt Development Group. At this time, we are working with our partner and development team to complete all of the due diligence items for the Bonds. We are now anticipating our HUD Closing in mid-November, before Thanksgiving, which will fund this project. The 338 units will be converted from Public Housing to Section 8 Project Based Units. After closing the rehabilitation project will begin and will take at least 12 months to complete. After the rehabilitation is completed and the units are reoccupied these units will become tax credit units. For at least the first three years, Hunt Development Group's Property Management Company (Pinnacle) will manage these units. It is SHA's desire and plan to manage these units after the first three years.

As a part of this project, SHA's Capital Fund Financing Program (CFFP) debt must be paid off. The current balance on the original debt of \$5.763 million is \$3,308,125.03. The financer of this loan requires that the debt must be paid off with the Housing Authority's Capital Funds. Certain portions of SHA's Capital Funds are already dedicated to the retirement of the debt, will go in, and will not be returned to the Authority. The plan is for the reminder of the funds to come from SHA's other available Capital Funds including Replacement Housing Factor Funds and would go in to pay off the debt at closing, but those funds would not stay in, but return immediately to the Housing Authority to complete the needed Capital Projects for which the funds were budgeted. Staff is working now to plan for the needs and use of these funds.

Brawley Street

The six new Public Housing units were occupied on December 5, 2014. While these units are occupied and we are receiving subsidy for each unit, we have not yet officially accepted these units from the contractor who constructed them. We are still working with the contractor and holding retainage of 10%, which is approximately \$115,000. We will continue to work to resolve these issues, which include; several change orders, failed parking strips, required documentation that have not yet been provided, LEED Certification, certain required Certified Payroll information, HUD required Close-Out documents, warranty issues and other items.

We have recently obtained the services of an Architectural & Engineering firm to complete an assessment of the units and to assist us with this process. In addition, we have also recently provided the contractor with a detailed list of deficiencies with specific directions on what needs to be accomplished to correct each deficiency. We have received a written response from Brownstone Construction Group and will continue to work to resolve the remaining issues.

OVERVIEW:

1. Public Housing Program

Occupancy Issues

Our Occupancy rate at the end of July 2015 for all of our Public Housing at 76%, 98% is our goal. Staff continues to work hard to lease all available units and we believe that this will correct quickly.

2. Rental Assistance Demonstration (RAD) Program

SHA Staff continues to move forward in its efforts to convert Public Housing units to Housing Choice Voucher Section 8 Project Based units through HUD's Rental Assistance Demonstration (RAD) Program. We are currently projecting the transition of 338 Public Housing units from the following apartment complexes; JC Anderson, Tobias, Barksdale, Leland, Spruce, Gooch and Watson at the first of next year (approximately January 2015). In addition, we are projecting the demolition of 40 units at Cammie Clagett and the construction of 72 new units on the location of Cammie Clagett beginning later in 2015.

Public Housing Utilization Project:

The chart below depicts the percentage of <u>only those units that are measured by HUD in our Public Housing Assessment System (PHAS) Score</u>, which were occupied as of the end of July 2015. This chart includes all Public Housing, other SHA Managed properties and also units (such as Low Income Housing Tax Credit Units – LIHTC) in which SHA does not own or manager but provides assistance through its Public Housing and Housing Choice Voucher assistance programs.

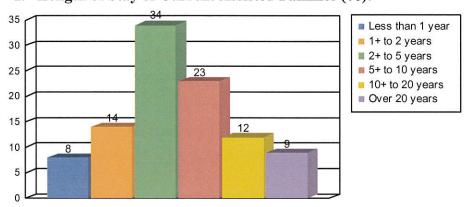

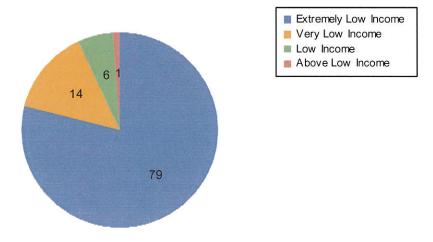

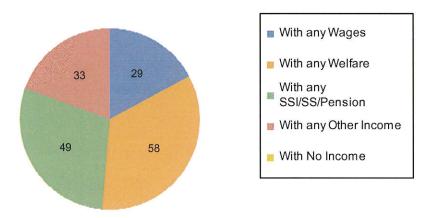
1. Length of Stay of Current Assisted Families (%):



2. Income Limits of Assisted Families (%):

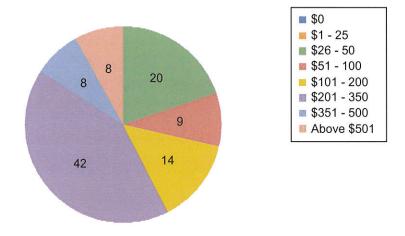


3. Source of Income of Assisted Families (%)

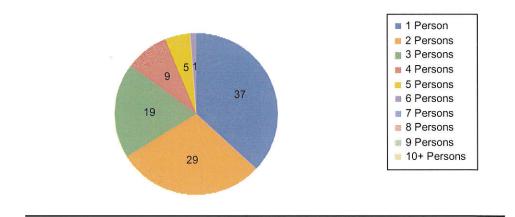


4. Total Tenant Payment (TTP) of Assisted Families (%)

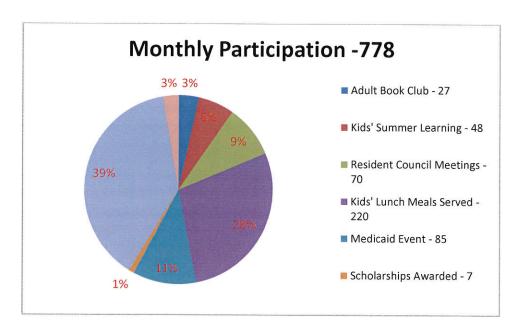
SUMMARY:

This report details activities of the Community and Supportive Services Department for the month of July 2015.

BACKGROUND:

The Community and Supportive Services Program at the Spartanburg Housing Authority strive to assist residents in becoming self-sufficient. For those motivated residents, the Family Self-Sufficiency Program is a five-year program whose final goal is that the resident becomes welfare free, although many become homeowners. Our Homeownership Institute, which is part of our FSS Program, instructs residents in what it takes to become a homeowner and offers counseling so the residents can improve their credit score and ultimately become mortgage qualified. Our Elderly and Disabled Program works with this population in self-sufficiency, which means they can continue to live independently with a good quality of life. At SHA, we have a "Connections" or pre-FSS program, which concentrates on group programming to foster self-improvement in adult residents, with case management available as necessary. We also provide resources for children to help them remain in school, and in addition, we concentrate on pregnancy prevention in teens.

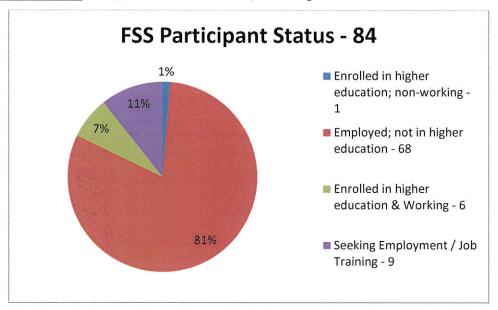

FSS Program – 84 (40 PH and 44 HCV) Participant Status



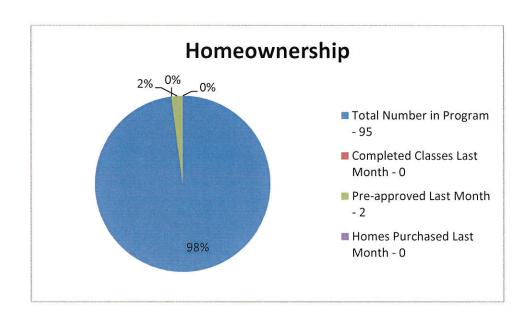

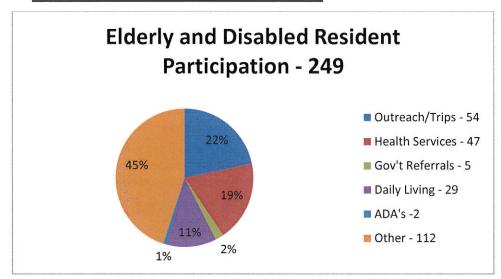

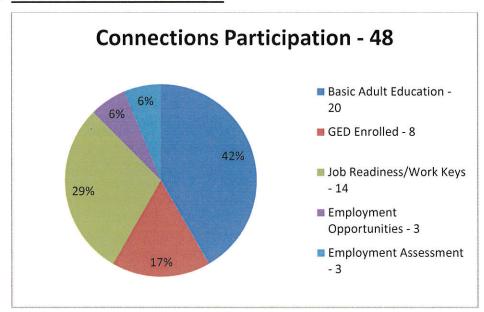

V: Status of Grants Programs – July, 2015

SHA's open/unspent *capital fund grant awards* total \$5,027,670 dollars of which \$1,418,599 has been drawdown to date. The remaining balance of all capital grants funds totals \$3,609,071 or 72.0 % of the total balance.

Specific details and composition of each grant award and their respective status are noted below:

- 1) **Open Replacement Housing Factor funds** (RHF) total awarded was \$1,122,279 and \$265,688 drawn against these grants leaving about \$856,591 available to spend.
- 2) There are currently three **ROSS** grant awards totaling \$1,041,907. The balance remaining unspent is \$425,627.
- 3) Total **Youth Build** grant award totaled \$1,099,878; to date \$1,054,440 has been spent. Total remaining Youth build grant dollars is \$45,438.
- 4) The Face Forward Grant award totaled \$1,000,000 and \$178,103 has been spent.
- 5) The AmeriCorps grant award totaled \$25,000 and all were spent. The amount of \$25,000 has been reimbursed and the grant is now closed.
- 6) The *Choice Neighborhood Initiative Grant (CNI)* was awarded \$300,000. To date we have drawn down a total of \$257,754.

SUMMARY:

SHA has rented office space from Mary Wright, LLC, since 2007.

BACKGROUND:

The owners of the Mary Wright building, which is leased to the SHA, were served a notice of foreclosure on July 2, 2015. SHA is seeking to rent 10,000 square feet of commercial office space as well as warehouse space of up to 10,000 square feet and facilities for parking vehicles. Staff has visited several potential commercial buildings and is viewing potential warehouse space. A packet of information regarding some of the properties visited is provided to the Board for your review as an example of the types and locations of the properties being considered.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The SHA is currently spending \$8,409 per month for rent (\$11.90 per sq ft) and an average of \$5,100 per month for utilities at 201 Caulder Avenue. Over the past nine (9) months of FY 2014-2015, the total expenses for rent and utilities have been \$121,281. Additionally, there is a janitorial contract which SHA pays \$12,500 annually for. Maintenance occurrences such as HVAC problems are paid for separately.

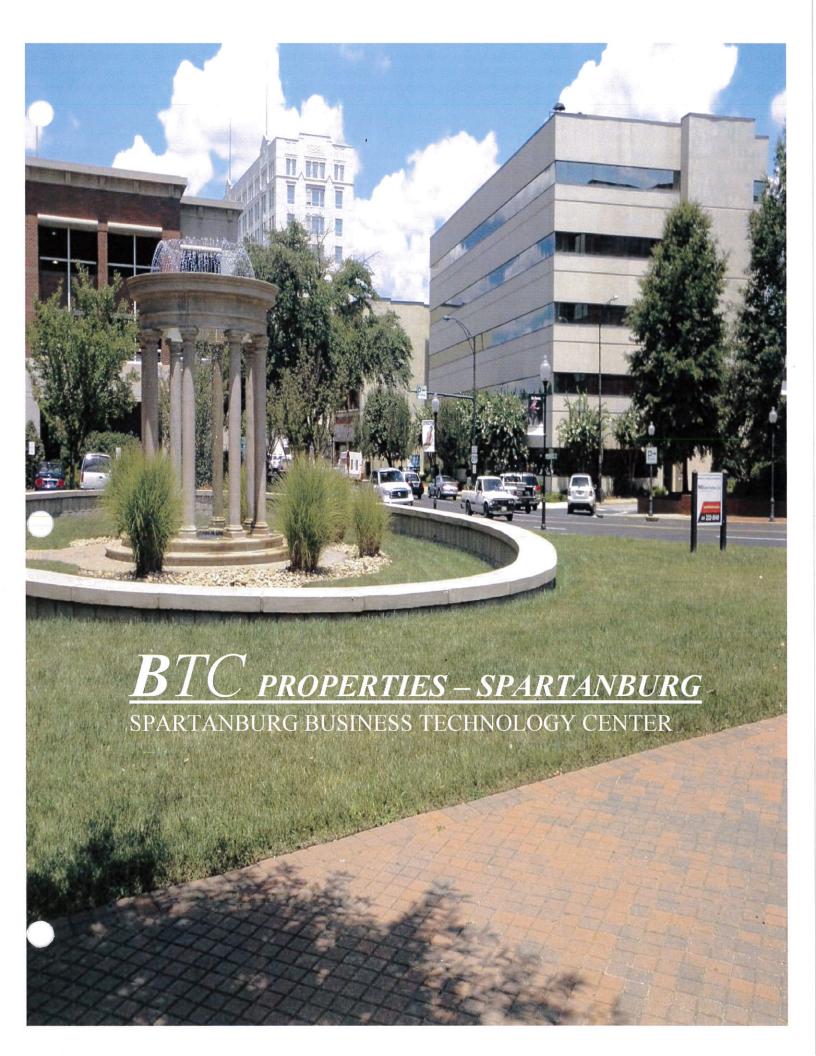
POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

We are submitting a request for the Executive Director to enter into a lease agreement for commercial office space for a period of 5-10 years at a cost not to exceed \$15/square (\$150k annually) foot if the utilities, taxes, common area maintenance and other similar services or an amount not to exceed \$12/square foot (\$120k) if utilities and building services are not included. The cost per square foot is governed by the length of the lease as well as the terms of the lease, which are all negotiable items. A more favorable cost per square foot is generally available if the lease term is longer.

Warehouse space averages \$2.50-5 per sq ft in Spartanburg. We are requesting that the Executive Director be permitted to enter into a separate lease agreement for up to 10,000 sq feet of warehouse space at a cost not to exceed \$5.00 per square foot.(\$25k-50k annually) This space is utilized for the storage of large equipment, unused equipment, construction documents, file documents and other related business materials. The agency will purge and seek to dispose of unusable material before completing a move.

Our reputation for integrity and excellence requires careful observance of the spirit and letter of all applicable laws and regulations, as well as scrupulous regard for the highest standards of conduct and personal integrity.

Therefore, it is essential that the Authority establish appropriate ethical standards to guide its personnel in the performance of their duties, so that there will not exist, nor appear to exist, a conflict between private interest and public responsibilities

Employees will not solicit, nor accept, gifts, gratuities, or loans from organizations, business concerns, or individuals with whom he/she has official relationships on business of the Housing Authority. These limitations are not intended to prohibit the acceptance of articles of negligible value, which are distributed generally, nor prohibit employees from obtaining loans from regular lending institutions. It is particularly important that inspectors, contracting officers, and procurement officers guard against relationships, which might be construed as evidence of favoritism, coercion, unfair advantage or collusion.

No employee is allowed to acquire an interest in any contract at a time when he/she has reason to believe that his/her interest will be affected either by his/her official actions or by the official actions of the Housing Authority.

An employee who has a financial interest in a business or activity that he/she has reason to believe may be affected by his/her official actions or by the actions of the Housing Authority will make disclosure of the exact nature and value of his/her interest in writing to the Executive Director in order that an opinion regarding the propriety of this interest can be officially obtained. Any employee who has such an interest shall disqualify himself/herself from participating in any official action directly affecting this interest.

Misconduct or violation of this code of conduct will not be tolerated and may result in disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.

The Code of Conduct will be distributed to all SHA employees, will be incorporated into the employee personnel policy and distributed to new employees at hire date.

Approval of Purchase Order to LESCO Restorations, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$100,000.00.

SUMMARY:

The Spartanburg Housing Authority would like to issue and additional purchase order in an amount not to exceed \$100,000.00 to LESCO Restorations, Inc. under a State Contract to replace roofs on 11 buildings at Camp Croft Apartments and to make repairs to water damages at the Prince Hall Office/Community Building on an emergency basis.

BACKGROUND:

In late May of 2015, there was sudden heavy downpour, which caused water to leak into the Office/Community Building at Prince Hall, which caused significant damage. Our Insurance Company estimated the cost of repairs to be \$7,281.42. As is the building is uninhabitable, we have moved our Staff to an alternate location, notified our Residents and closed the building. We need to make repairs to the building as soon as possible. LESCO Restorations, Inc. has given us their estimate to repair the building at \$6,500.00.

The roofs at Camp Croft Apartments have been deteriorating now from some time. During the last storm, we had significant roof leaks in 11 buildings. Although our Staff has made commendable efforts to repair and patch these roofs, we must replace these roofs on the 11 buildings immediately. LESCO Restorations, Inc. has given us an estimate for this work of \$86,955.00.

These two work items total to \$93,455.00. We would like the purchase order amount to be for an amount not to exceed \$100,000.00. This will allow for contingencies, as both of these amounts

are estimates. It is not unusual, especially in roofing work to uncover rotten wood that will need to be replaced, and bring additional costs. If possible, we would also like to be able to use the purchase order to include several additional unit turns.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The emergency work at the Office/Community Building at Prince Hall will be paid for from the sites regular operating funds and reserves and if necessary from SHA's Capital Funds.

The emergency roofing work on the eleven buildings at Camp Croft will be paid for from the 2014 Capital Fund Budget. SHA has a total of \$250,711.76 budget for roofing at Camp Croft. Camp Croft has 50 buildings, 11 buildings of 50 represent 22%. At \$86,955.00 for the replacement of roofs for eleven buildings, this will leave a balance of \$163,756.76 or 65%. Based upon these numbers, we could potentially have a gap of \$36,812.84 when we replace the balance of the roofs. If necessary, we could cover this gap by revising the budget in the 2014 Capital Funds.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS:

This procurement requires Board approval because it exceeds SHA's small purchase threshold of \$10,000.00. In addition, our Procurement Policy allows SHA to purchase materials like these through a Cooperative Purchasing agreement as detailed in section III. F. on page 12 and other provisions of our Procurement Policy as adopted by the Board of Commissioners on September 23, 2014 and revised July 21, 2015.
